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**BETTE DEMARTINI, M.D.,** says:

On or about May 7, 1982, I was licensed to practice medicine as a physician in the State of New York having been issued License No. 149992 by the New York State Education Department. I currently reside at 8 Sea Spray Road, Westport, CT 06880.

I am not currently registered with the New York State Education Department to practice as a physician in the State of New York.

I understand that the New York State Board for Professional Medical Conduct has charged me with one specification of professional misconduct as set forth in the Statement of Charges, annexed hereto, made a part hereof, and marked as Exhibit "A."

I am applying to the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct for an agreement to allow me to surrender my license as a physician in the State of New York and request that the Board issue this Surrender Order.

I, hereby, agree not to contest the one (1) specification set forth in the Statement of Charges (Exhibit A).

I understand that in the event that this proposed agreement is not granted by the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct, nothing contained herein shall be binding upon me or construed to be an admission of any act of misconduct alleged or charged against me, such proposed agreement shall not be used against me in any way, and shall be kept in strict

confidence during the pendency of the professional misconduct disciplinary proceeding; and such denial by the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct shall be made without prejudice to the continuance of any disciplinary proceeding and the final determination by a Committee on Professional Medical Conduct pursuant to the provisions of the Public Health Law.



STATEMENT

OF

CHARGES

**BETTE DEMARTINI, M.D.**, the Respondent, was authorized to practice medicine in New York state on May 7, 1982, by the issuance of license number 149992 by the New York State Education Department.

### FACTUAL ALLEGATIONS

A. On or about February 18, 2005, the State of Connecticut, Department of Public Health, Bureau of Healthcare Systems, (hereinafter "Connecticut Board"), by a Voluntary Surrender of Licensure Affidavit, (hereinafter "Connecticut Order"), accepted the voluntary surrender of Respondent's license to practice medicine and surgery, based on moral unfitness.

B. The conduct resulting in the Connecticut Board disciplinary action against Respondent would constitute misconduct under the laws of New York state, pursuant to the following sections of New York state Law:

1. New York Education Law §6530(20) (moral unfitness in the practice of medicine).

### SPECIFICATION

Respondent violated New York Education Law §6530(9)(d) by having voluntarily or otherwise surrendered her license to practice medicine after a disciplinary action was instituted by a duly authorized professional disciplinary agency of another state, where the conduct resulting in the surrender would, if committed in New York state, constitute professional misconduct under the laws New York state, in that Petitioner charges:

1. The facts in Paragraphs A and/or B.
