STEPHEN P. POLLITT, P.A., says:

On or about August 4, 1978, I was licensed to practice medicine as a physician assistant in the State of New York having been issued License No. 000904 by the New York State Education Department. I currently reside at 131 Stewart Drive, Warner Robbins, GA 31093.

I am currently registered with the New York State Education Department to practice as a physician assistant in the State of New York.

I understand that the New York State Board for Professional Medical Conduct has charged me with one (1) specification of professional misconduct as set forth in the Statement of Charges, annexed hereto, made a part hereof, and marked as Exhibit "A."

I am applying to the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct for an agreement to allow me to surrender my license as a physician assistant in the State of New York and request that the Board issue this Surrender Order.

I, hereby, agree not to contest the one (1) specification set forth in the Statement of Charges (Exhibit A).

I understand that in the event that this proposed agreement is not granted by the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct, nothing contained herein shall be binding upon me or construed to be an admission of any act of misconduct alleged or charged against me, such proposed agreement shall not be used against me in any way, and shall be kept in strict

confidence during the pendency of the professional misconduct disciplinary proceeding; and such denial by the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct shall be made without prejudice to the continuance of any disciplinary proceeding and the final determination by a Committee on Professional Medical Conduct pursuant to the provisions of the Public Health Law.

I agree that, in the event the Board grants my Application, as set forth herein, an order of the Chairperson of the Board shall be issued in accordance with same upon issuance by the Board, which may be accomplished by mailing, by first class mail, a copy of the Order to me at the address set forth above or to my attorney or upon transmission via facsimile to me or my attorney, whichever is first.


I am making this agreement of my own free will and accord and not under duress, compulsion or restraint of any kind of manner.

STATEMENT
OF
CHARGES

STEPHEN P. POLLITT, P.A., Respondent, was authorized to practice medicine in New York state on August 4, 1978, as a Physician Assistant, by the issuance of license number 000904 by the New York State Education Department.

FACTUAL ALLEGATIONS

A. On or about July 14, 2005, the State of Georgia, Composite State Board of Medical Examiners, (hereinafter "Georgia Board"), by a Public Consent Order (hereinafter "Georgia Order"), placed Respondent's license to practice medicine, as a physician's assistant, on probation with terms and conditions, until discharged by the Georgia Board, based on a history of alcoholic abuse.

B. The conduct resulting in the Georgia Board disciplinary action against Respondent would constitute misconduct under the laws of New York State, pursuant to the following sections of New York State law:

1. New York Education Law §6530 (8) (being a habitual abuser of alcohol).

SPECIFICATION

Respondent violated New York Education Law §6530(9)(d) by having disciplinary action taken by a duly authorized professional disciplinary agency of another state, where the conduct resulting in the disciplinary action would, if committed in New York State, constitute professional misconduct under the laws of New York state, in that Petitioner charges:

1. The facts in Paragraphs A and/or B.
