KULDEEP SINGH, M.D., says:

On or about February 25, 1977, I was licensed to practice medicine as a physician in the State of New York having been issued License No. 130132 by the New York State Education Department. I currently reside at 1005 North Rutherford Macon, MO 63552.

I am not currently registered with the New York State Education Department to practice as a physician in the State of New York.

I understand that the New York State Board for Professional Medical Conduct has charged me with two (2) specifications of professional misconduct as set forth in the Statement of Charges, annexed hereto, made a part hereof, and marked as Exhibit "A."

I am applying to the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct for an agreement to allow me to surrender my license as a physician in the State of New York and request that the Board issue this Surrender Order.

I, hereby, agree not to contest the two (2) specifications set forth in the Statement of Charges (Exhibit A), as I do not intend to return to the state of New York to practice medicine.


I understand that, in the event that this proposed agreement is not granted by the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct, nothing contained herein shall be binding upon me or construed to be an admission of any act of misconduct alleged or charged against me, such proposed agreement shall not be used against me in any way, and shall be kept in strict confidence during the pendency of the professional misconduct disciplinary proceeding; and

such denial by the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct shall be made without prejudice to the continuance of any disciplinary proceeding and the final determination by a Committee on Professional Medical Conduct pursuant to the provisions of the Public Health Law.

I agree that, in the event the Board grants my Application, as set forth herein, an order of the Chairperson of the Board shall be issued in accordance with same upon issuance by the Board, which may be accomplished by mailing, by first class mail, a copy of the Order to me at the address set forth above, or to my attorney, or upon transmission via facsimile to me or my attorney, whichever is first.

I am making this agreement of my own free will and accord and not under duress, compulsion, or restraint of any kind or manner.



STATEMENT
OF
CHARGES

KULDEEP SINGH, M.D., the Respondent, was authorized to practice medicine in New York state on February 25, 1977, by the issuance of license number 130132 by the New York State Education Department.

FACTUAL ALLEGATIONS

A. On or about March 12, 2001, the State of Missouri, State Board of Registration for the Healing Arts (hereinafter "Missouri Board"), by a Settlement Agreement (hereinafter "Missouri Agreement"), accepted the Voluntary Surrender of Respondent's license to practice medicine, based on Respondent obtaining prescription pain medications from at least three (3) different physicians in amounts which are in aggregate, excessive, ordering and self-administering Toradol by injection while on duty at a hospital emergency room, self-medicating with Schedule IV Controlled Substances, and suffering from depression.

B. The conduct resulting in the Missouri Board disciplinary actions against Respondent would constitute misconduct under the laws of New York state, pursuant to the following sections of New York state law:

1. New York Education Law §6530(2) (practicing the profession fraudulently or beyond its authorized scope);

2. New York Education Law §6530(7) (practicing the profession while impaired by drugs or physical or mental disability); and/or

3. New York Education Law §6530(8) (being dependent on or a habitual user of drugs).

SPECIFICATIONS

FIRST SPECIFICATION

Respondent violated New York Education Law §6530(9)(b) by reason of having been found guilty of improper professional practice or professional misconduct by a duly authorized professional disciplinary agency of another state where the conduct upon which the finding was based would, if committed in New York state, constitute professional misconduct under the laws of New York state, in that Petitioner charges:

1. The facts in Paragraph A and/or B.

SECOND SPECIFICATION

Respondent violated New York State Education Law §6530 (9)(d) by having voluntarily surrendering his license to practice medicine or having had other disciplinary action taken after a disciplinary action was instituted by a duly authorized professional disciplinary agency of another state, where the conduct resulting in the voluntary surrender or other disciplinary action would, if committed in New York state, constitute professional misconduct under the laws of New York state, in that Petitioner charges:

2. The facts in Paragraphs A and/or B.

ORDER


