Upon the Application of GEORGE BROUN, M.D. (Respondent) to Surrender his/her license as a physician in the State of New York, which application is made a part hereof, it is


ORDERED, that the application and the provisions thereof are hereby adopted; it is further


I agree that in the event the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct grants my application, an order shall be issued striking my name from the roster of physicians in the State of New York without further notice to me.

**STATEMENT
OF
CHARGES**

GEORGE BROUN, M.D., the Respondent, was authorized to practice medicine in New York State on or about 1967, by the issuance of license number 098192 by the New York State Education Department.

FACTUAL ALLEGATIONS

- A. On or about November, 1988, the Respondent, a psychiatrist, entered into an arrangement with an unlicensed psychotherapist to issue bills in Respondent's own name for psychotherapy sessions that the unlicensed therapist rendered to Patient A. Respondent understood that by issuing of bills in his own name he represented that he had actually treated Patient A, when in fact, he knew that he had never treated her. On or about and between November, 1988 and February, 1990 the Respondent signed 8 bills for 66 one hour psychotherapy sessions for Patient A. The bills were submitted to the Prudential Insurance Company of America, IBM Claim Division. .

SPECIFICATION OF CHARGES
