In or about 1951, I was licensed to practice as a physician in the State of New York having been issued License No. 071697 by the New York State Education Department.

I am registered with the New York State Education Department to practice as a physician in the State of New York for the period beginning on January 1, 1991 and ending on December 31, 1992. My registration address is 372 S. Oyster Bay Road, Hicksville, NY 11801-3508.

I understand that I have been charged with one specification of professional misconduct as set forth in the Statement of Charges, annexed hereto, made a part hereof, and marked as Exhibit "A".

I am applying to the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct for permission to surrender my license as a physician in the State of New York on the grounds that I admit the specification of professional misconduct as set forth in the charges.

I hereby make this application to the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct and request that it be granted.

I understand that, in the event that the application is not granted by the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct, nothing contained herein shall be binding upon me or construed to be an admission of any act of misconduct alleged or charged against me, such application shall not be used against me in any way, and shall be kept in strict confidence during the pendency of the professional misconduct disciplinary proceeding; and such denial by the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct shall be made without prejudice to the continuance of any disciplinary proceeding and the final determination by a Committee on Professional Medical Conduct pursuant to the provisions of the Public Health Law.

I agree that in the event the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct grants my application, an order shall be issued

striking my name from the roster of physicians in the State of New York without further notice to me.

I am making this Application of my own free will and accord and not under duress, compulsion, or restraint of any kind or manner.





Arthur J. Gross, M.D., the Respondent, was authorized to practice medicine in New York State in 1951 by the issuance of license number 071697 by the New York State Education Department. The Respondent is currently registered with the New York State Education Department to practice medicine for the period January 1, 1992 through December 31, 1992

FACTUAL ALLEGATIONS

- A. On or about October 9, 1992, in the First District Court of Nassau County, Respondent was convicted, upon a guilty plea, of committing an unclassified misdemeanor in violation of N.Y. Public Health Law section 3332 which prohibits prescribing of a substance for which an official New York State Prescription is required, "except on an official New York state prescription, and in good faith and in the course of his professional practice only."

SPECIFICATION

Respondent is charged with committing professional misconduct within the meaning of NY Educ. Law Section 6530(9)(a)(1) (McKinney Supp. 1992) by being convicted of committing an act constituting a crime under New York state law in that Petitioner charges:
