CRAIG ROBERT NUNN, M.D., says:

On or about September 8, 1992, I was licensed to practice medicine as a physician in the State of New York having been issued License No. 190305 by the New York State Education Department. I currently reside at Inmate Number 300265, Middle Tennessee Correctional Complex, 7177 Cockrill Bend Industrial Road, Nashville, Tennessee 37243-0470.

I am not currently registered with the New York State Education Department to practice as a physician in the State of New York.

I understand that the New York State Board for Professional Medical Conduct has charged me with two (2) specifications of professional misconduct as set forth in the Statement of Charges, annexed hereto, made a part hereof, and marked as Exhibit "A."

I am applying to the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct for an agreement to allow me to surrender my license as a physician in the State of New York and request that the Board issue this Surrender Order.

I hereby agree not to contest the two (2) specifications set forth in the Statement of Charges (Exhibit A).


I understand that, in the event that this proposed agreement is not granted by the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct, nothing contained herein shall be binding upon me or construed to be an admission of any act of misconduct alleged or charged against me, such

proposed agreement shall not be used against me in any way, and shall be kept in strict confidence during the pendency of the professional misconduct disciplinary proceeding; and such denial by the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct shall be made without prejudice to the continuance of any disciplinary proceeding and the final determination by a Committee on Professional Medical Conduct pursuant to the provisions of the Public Health Law.

I agree that, in the event the Board grants my Application, as set forth herein, an order of the Chairperson of the Board shall be issued in accordance with same upon issuance by the Board, which may be accomplished by mailing, by first class mail, a copy of the Order to me at the address set forth above, or to my attorney, or upon transmission via facsimile to me or my attorney, whichever is first.


I am making this agreement of my own free will and accord and not under duress, compulsion, or restraint of any kind of manner.



STATEMENT
OF
CHARGES

CRAIG ROBERT NUNN, M.D., the Respondent, was authorized to practice medicine in New York state on September 8, 1992, by the issuance of license number 190305 by the New York State Education Department.

FACTUAL ALLEGATIONS

A. On or about January 14, 1999, in the Criminal Court for Davidson County, Tennessee, Respondent was found guilty of four (4) counts of Aggravated Sexual Battery and was sentenced to twelve (12) years confinement on each charge to be served concurrently.

B. On or about January 26, 1999, the State of Tennessee, Department of Health, Board of Medical Examiners (hereinafter "Tennessee Board"), by an Agreed Order (hereinafter "Tennessee Order"), revoked the license of the Respondent to practice medicine based on the criminal conviction described in paragraph A above.

SPECIFICATIONS

FIRST SPECIFICATION

Respondent violated New York Education Law §6530(9)(a)(iii) by being convicted of an act constituting a crime under the law of another jurisdiction and which, if committed in New York state, would have constituted a crime under New York state law, in that Petitioner charges:

SECOND SPECIFICATION

Respondent violated New York State Education Law §6530(9)(d) by reason of having had disciplinary action taken or having had his license to practice medicine revoked after a disciplinary action was instituted by a duly authorized professional disciplinary agency of another state, where the conduct resulting in the disciplinary action or revocation would, if committed in New York state, constitute professional misconduct under the laws of New York state, in that Petitioner charges:
