TADEUSZ WODECKI, M.D., says:

On or about November 24, 1986, I was licensed to practice medicine as a physician in the State of New York having been issued License No.169758 by the New York State Education Department. My address is 2256 Rockbridge Road, Stone Mountain, GA 30087.

I understand that I have been charged with two (2) specifications of professional misconduct as set forth in the Statement of Charges, annexed hereto, made a part hereof, and marked as Exhibit "A."

I am applying to the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct for an agreement to allow me to surrender my license as a physician in the State of New York and request that the Board issue this Surrender Order.

I do not contest the two (2) specifications set forth in the Statement of Charges.

I understand that, in the event that this proposed agreement is not granted by the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct, nothing contained herein shall be binding upon me or construed to be an admission of any act of misconduct alleged or charged against me, such proposed agreement shall not be used against me in any way, and shall be kept in strict confidence during the pendency of the professional misconduct disciplinary proceeding; and such denial by the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct shall be made without prejudice to the continuance of any disciplinary proceeding and the final determination by a Committee on Professional Medical Conduct pursuant to the provisions of the Public Health Law.

I agree that in the event the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct agrees with my proposal, this Order shall be issued striking my name from the roster of physicians in the State of New York without further notice to me. I agree that this Order shall be effective upon issuance by the Board, which may be accomplished by mailing, by first class mail, a copy of the Order to me at the address set forth above, or to my attorney, or upon transmission via facsimile to me or my attorney, whichever is earliest.

I am making this agreement of my own free will and accord and not under duress, compulsion, or restraint of any kind or manner.

ORDER



TADEUSZ WODECKI, M.D., the Respondent, was authorized to practice medicine in New York State on November 24, 1986 by the issuance of license number 168758 by the New York State Education Department.

**FACTUAL ALLEGATIONS**

A. On or about March 3, 1999, the Composite State Board of Medical Examiners, State of Georgia, (hereinafter "Georgia Board"), entered a Consent Order, (hereinafter "Georgia Order"), wherein, among other things, the Respondent's license to practice medicine was suspended for 45 days, he was placed on probation for a period of 3 years subject to terms and conditions, ordered to cease and desist from purchasing, ordering and/or dispensing controlled substances, publicly reprimanded, ordered to complete 20 hours of Continuing Medical Education (CME) training, and to pay a \$5,000.00 fine based on allegations that, among other things, that he violated rules of the Board by failing to comply with the minimal standard of acceptable and prevailing medical practice with regard to two (2) patients, and violated the rules

of the State Board of Pharmacy governing practitioner dispensing of drugs and findings that Respondent's conduct constitutes sufficient grounds for disciplinary action.

B. The conduct resulting in the Georgia Board's disciplinary action against Respondent would constitute misconduct under the laws of New York State, pursuant to the following sections of New York State Law:

~~2.~~ New York Education Law §6530(16) (willful failure to comply with substantial provisions of federal, state or local laws, rules governing the practice of medicine).

#### **SPECIFICATIONS**

##### **FIRST SPECIFICATION**

Respondent is guilty of violating New York Education Law §6530(9)(b) by reason of having been found guilty of improper professional practice or professional misconduct by a duly authorized professional disciplinary agency of another state where the conduct upon which the finding was based would, if committed in New York State, constitute professional misconduct committed in New York State, in that the Petitioner charges the following:

1. The facts in paragraphs A and/or B.

**SECOND SPECIFICATION**

Respondent is guilty of professional misconduct under New York State Education Law §6530(9)(d) by reason of his having had disciplinary action taken against him by a duly authorized professional disciplinary agency of another state, where the conduct resulting in the disciplinary action would, if committed in New York State, constitute professional misconduct under the laws of New York State, in that the Petitioner charges:

2. The facts in paragraphs A and/or B.
