MARCOS U. RAMOS, M.D., says:

On or about September 15, 1975, I was licensed to practice medicine as a physician in the State of New York having been issued License No. 125241 by the New York State Education Department. I currently reside at MCI-Concord, ID#W60760, 965 Elm Street, Concord, MA 01742.

I am not currently registered with the New York State Education Department to practice as a physician in the State of New York.

I understand that the New York State Board for Professional Medical Conduct has charged me with two (2) specifications of professional misconduct as set forth in the Statement of Charges, annexed hereto, made a part hereof, and marked as Exhibit "A."

I am applying to the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct for an agreement to allow me to surrender my license as a physician in the State of New York and request that the Board issue this Surrender Order.

I, hereby, agree not to contest the two (2) specifications set forth in the Statement of Charges (Exhibit A).

I understand that in the event that this proposed agreement is not granted by the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct, nothing contained herein shall be binding upon me or construed to be an admission of any act of misconduct alleged or charged against me, such

proposed agreement shall not be used against me in any way, and shall be kept in strict confidence during the pendency of the professional misconduct disciplinary proceeding; and such denial by the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct shall be made without prejudice to the continuance of any disciplinary proceeding and the final determination by a Committee on Professional Medical Conduct pursuant to the provisions of the Public Health Law.

I agree that, in the event the Board grants my Application, as set forth herein, an order of the Chairperson of the Board shall be issued in accordance with same upon issuance by the Board, which may be accomplished by mailing, by first class mail, a copy of the Order to me at the address set forth above or to my attorney or upon transmission via facsimile to me or my attorney, whichever is first.

I am making this agreement of my own free will and accord and not under duress, compulsion or restraint of any kind or manner.

STATEMENT
OF
CHARGES

MARCOS U. RAMOS, M.D., the Respondent, was authorized to practice medicine in New York state on September 15, 1975, by the issuance of license number 125241 by the New York State Education Department.

FACTUAL ALLEGATIONS

A. On or about June 21, 2001, in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, Suffolk Superior Court, Respondent was found guilty of two (2) counts of indecent assault and battery on a person who had attained age fourteen and on or about July 19, 2001, was sentenced three (3) to five (5) years confinement at Massachusetts Correctional Institution Cedar Junction (hereinafter "MCICJ"), five (5) years probation from and after release from MCICJ with conditions, and a \$60.00 victim-witness fee.

B. On or about June 21, 2001, in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, Suffolk Superior Court, Respondent was convicted of eleven (11) counts of indecent assault and battery on a person who had attained age fourteen and on or about July 19, 2001, was sentenced to three (3) to five (5) years confinement at MCICJ and five (5) years probation from and after release from MCICJ to run concurrent with the sentenced described in Paragraph A above.
